Theme – Skills for the Next Generation: Working, Learning and Living Online

Technology is changing at an increasingly fast pace, and this poses particular issues for colleges, universities and training providers as they strive to keep in touch. Social networking online is changing the way people interact with each other, how they take in information, and how they view the world. What are the implications for the way education and training is delivered, and how can we keep ahead of game in meeting learner expectations?

Digital 2010 has commissioned research into Next Generation User Skills which aims to envision, to project and to influence the development of both local and national skills provision. The research is working towards an outcome which will provide partners in the region with the tools to predict the skills that will be in everyday use in 2013 and which education and training providers need to gear themselves up to deliver now.

The JISC Regional Support Centre is working with providers in the region to assist them to incorporate Web 2.0 tools into their provision, ensure they can meet learner expectations, and that they can work together to embed best practice in this arena into their delivery.
